





Old Business:

- Roadside sign update/discussion: Quotes are being sought out to get an idea of the cost of going digital.
- February cleaning work bee/discussion: Being put on hold until March.

New Business:

- Constant light bulb changing concerns/discussion: New bulbs correctly suited for canned lighting will be purchased and installed. If the issue still continues, then an electrician will be contacted.
- AV update/motion: Hard reset & reinstallation of programs completed on the Audio-Visual computer. Next needed is Microsoft Office 365. Also, a Gmail account will be set up for AV functionality/security purposes.
- Web service issues/discussion: Due to web servicing issues, Julie would like to check into what other churches are using as well as, other pricing options.
- Newspaper ad's/motion: Due to advertising cost increases vs expenditure worth, and given the fact that Google searches & business websites are the most popular ways people look up information, it was decided to stop running ads in the newspaper. In the event that an advertisement is required, the office shall notify the Memorial Committee and ask that their fund be used to cover the bill.
- AED Training/discussion: Volunteers for AED and CPR training are needed. People must be trained to operate our Automated External Defibrillator (AED) in case an emergency occurs.
- Sacred Spaces/discussion: Meetings are ongoing. The acceptance of bids will occur soon.
- Community Center Grant/discussion: HTLC was not awarded this grant.
- Nominations for Audit Committee/discussion: Each year the Council needs to nominate an individual to join the Audit Committee. This term will run from 2024 to 2026. Nominations were received.
- Frequency of Council meetings/motion: Council meetings will occur every other month, unless an emergency occurs, in which case a special Council meeting will be held.

• Income for January: \$9,969.98 vs expenses for December \$11,606.50, which leaves a deficit for the month of: -\$1,636.52

for the Month of March

Third Sunday in Lent March 3, 2024

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

Fourth Sunday in Lent March 10,2024

The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Holy God, we confess that we are caught in snares of sin and cannot break free. We hoard resources while our neighbors are hungry and cold. We speak in ways that silence others. We are silent when we should speak up. We keep score in our hearts. We let hurts grow into hatred. For all these things and for sins only you know, forgive us, Lord. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Holy God, through your Son you have called us to live faithfully and act courageously. Keep us steadfast in your covenant of grace, and teach us the wisdom that comes only through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Fifth Sunday in Lent March 17, 2024

God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join together in worship, sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world.

Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday March 24, 2024

This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Holy God, we confess that we are caught in snares of sin and cannot break free. We hoard resources while our neighbors are hungry and cold. We speak in ways that silence others. We are silent when we should speak up. We keep score in our hearts. We let hurts grow into hatred. For all these things and for sins only you know, forgive us, Lord. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, with steadfast love you draw us to yourself, and in mercy you receive our prayers. Strengthen us to bring forth the fruits of the Spirit, that through life and death we may live in your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Maundy Thursday March 28, 2024

Every Sunday in worship the church celebrates the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit gathers us to receive again the gifts of God that come to us through Christ, the saving Word. On several key days at the center of the church year, however, worship takes a particular shape. These central days have come to be known as the Three Days, recalling Jesus' own words to his disciples that he would be handed over to death, and that "after three days he will rise again" (Mark 10:34). The Three Days encompass the time from Maundy Thursday evening through the evening of Easter Day. In particular, the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter unfold in a single movement, as the church each year makes the passage with Christ through death into life.

Good Friday March 29, 2024

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In John's passion account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days in the Easter Vigil.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Most merciful God, we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Holy God, source of all love, on the night of his betrayal, Jesus gave us a new commandment, to love one another as he loves us.
